

# Electronic Transcripts Have Arrived!

## TREx National Option Expands TREx Benefits

Schools throughout Texas are adopting TREx, the innovative new program that transfers student records and transcripts electronically — saving time and money while improving data accuracy and security. State legislation provides TREx to public schools in Texas free of charge. For a small fee per transaction, school districts can add the TREx National Option, which expands the benefits of electronic transcripts to a much broader range of recipients:

### TREx System Only

Approximately 10,000 institutions, including:

- ✓ Every K-12 public school in Texas
- ✓ Every Texas public college & university
- ✓ Any college on the UT SPEEDE server
- ✓ Private schools that pay to join TREx

### TREx System with the TREx National Option

Over 137,000 institutions across the country, including:

- ✓ All recipients in the TREx system (free)
- ✓ Texas private colleges & universities
- ✓ All public & private K-12 schools in the country
- ✓ All out-of-state colleges & universities
- ✓ Scholarship providers
- ✓ Certifying bodies
- ✓ Armed Forces

#### When a high school registrar sends a record or transcript...

- ▶ Eligible K-12 schools are sent electronic records through the TREx system.
- ▶ Eligible higher education institutions are sent electronic transcripts through the SPEEDE server.

#### When a high school registrar sends a record or transcript...

- ▶ All schools in the TREx network receive electronic records as described to the left.
- ▶ Non-TREx institutions that are NTC members are sent electronic records in their preferred data format through the NTC system.
- ▶ Non-TREx institutions that are not NTC members are sent paper transcripts on secure paper via the NTC Print Center.
- ▶ Registrars always have the option of fulfilling non-TREx transactions by using the current manual process.
